Fifth Steering Committee Meeting of the National Policy Dialogue on Integrated Water Resources Management in Dushanbe

24 May 2013

DUSHANBE – Fifth Steering Committee meeting of the National Policy Dialogue on Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) in Kyrgyzstan (NPD) took place on 23 May 2013. The UNECE- led event was hosted by the Ministry of Land Reclamation and Water Resources of the Republic of Tajikistan and supported by "Water Management and Basin Organisations in Central Asia (WMBOCA)" project, which is funded by the European Union and implemented by <u>Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH</u>, Transboundary Water Management in Central Asia Programme.

Policy makers, representatives of water management agencies on national level, scientific institutions, international organisations and other stakeholders met to discuss further direction of joint work in water management.

Topics for sessions ranged from the global post-2015 development agenda to water and health issues. One of the topics was involvement of international and other organisations with regards to support of IWRM implementation in Tajikistan; further perspectives for cooperation development in the framework of water sector reform were discussed.

The issue of transboundary water management was in the focus of attention: experience in the Isfara river basin was presented. In this river basin two riparian states, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan, successfully cooperated on local and national levels supported by WMBOCA project: working groups for both Tajik and Kyrgyz parts developed basin plan, the first draft will be finalised in autumn 2013. Basin planning concept and activities were presented on the event as well. Being part of the IWRM, basin planning approach takes into account different ways of the water use (ranging from agriculture to sanitation), demographic changes and consequent changes of water demand, water availability for ecosystems.
